Envelope Use/Online Giving

An average of about 105 envelopes are used each week and about 55 people currently use Online Giving. We mail envelope packets to close to 400 people/households. I ask everyone to help support your parish. I ask everyone, if possible, to use Online Giving, or else, please make use of your envelopes. If you contribute online and no longer wish to receive envelopes, please notify the parish office so that we are not wasting money. If you receive envelopes and attend the Sunday 6pm Mass, please use your envelope if you intend for your contribution to support the church operation. Taking a Fresh Look
