CHRISM MASS

APRIL 10, 2017 AT 7:30 P.M.

CATHEDRAL OF ST. FRANCIS OF ASSISI, METUCHEN

On Monday, April 10, 2017 Bishop James F. Checcio will celebrate the Chrism Mass with the priests of the Diocese. At this Mass, the Bishop will bless the Holy Oils which each parish receives for the rites of anointing. Saint Ambrose [340-397] began this custom – which we now call the Chrism Mass – in his Cathedral in Milan. These Holy Oils, which are used to sanctify the Faithful, have been channels of holiness for centuries! The **Oil of Catechumens** is used to anoint infants and adults before their Baptism; the **Oil of the Sick** is used on the forehead and hands of the infirm in the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick; and **Sacred Chrism** is used to anoint the head of the newly baptized, the foreheads of confirmandi, the hands of a priest at his ordination, the head of a bishop at his ordination, and the altar and walls of new churches. At the Mass, all priests make a **Renewal of Commitment to Priestly Service**, recommitting themselves to their Bishop and to their ministry to God and His People; the Bishop and all Priests then ask the people for a pledge of their prayerful support. **All are strongly encouraged to join in the ancient, grace-filled Chrism Mass at the Cathedral of St. Francis of Assisi in Metuchen at 7:30 p.m.**

A PASTORAL EXHORTATION

Enter prayerfully into this HOLY WEEK. The church invites you to reflect on those events without which you would be without hope of finding fulfilment. Even when facing rejection, betrayal, physical pain... even agony, abandonment, being mocked, even death — even then you could have hope because the events of our own life can be experienced in solidarity with Jesus. Realize the immensity of the gift that Jesus gives you by embracing those events with patience, forgiveness, humility, faithfulness, self-sacrifice...

What power enabled him to do that? How could he? The answer: His love for you. The strength of his commitment to you. The depth of his desire for you to be happy in the way that God intended for you from the beginning.

Don't gloss over this week. Allow your heart to be drawn into the love God has for you. Allow the events of Holy Week to stir your heart and energize your love.

Take time to be with the Lord. Who is Jesus for you? What difference does he make in the way you think and see and choose? Jesus has emptied himself through this week's events to let you know that he loves you, more deeply than you can imagine. Pray this week for the graces needed to love the Lord more deeply, to rightly prioritize your values, to loosen your grip on the lesser loves to which you are attached and to see that your relationship with Christ is the most necessary part of life. Pray for the grace to respond to the events of your life by emptying yourself of self-concern in a Christ-like way, and to express love for God and all others.

### Holy Land Collection Good Friday, April 14

Pope Francis has asked our parish to support the Pontifical Good Friday Collection, which helps Christians in the Holy Land. ### Oppose NJ Assisted Suicide

**Bill S2474, the NJ “Aid in Dying for the Terminally Ill” Act**, was released from the Senate Health, Human Services, and Senior Citizen’s Committee on November 3, 2016 and **could be posted for a vote in the full Senate at any time**. An identical bill, A2451, passed the General Assembly on October 20th. The bill would allow physicians to prescribe drugs to end the lives of individuals considered to be terminally ill.

This assisted suicide bill is a direct threat to anyone viewed as a cost liability to an insurance company. In an era of cost control and managed care, patients with lingering illnesses may be branded as an economic liability, and decisions to encourage death could be driven by cost.

The facts are clear - in California, in Vermont and in Oregon - states that have passed assisted suicide bills - insurance companies have denied individuals healthcare coverage but offered them low cost drugs to end their life. **Please contact your state legislators and tell them that you oppose A2451/S2474. ## CHURCH INTERIOR RENEWAL PROJECT, STEPPING FORWARD WITH CHRIST

Capital expenditures that exceed \$25,000 require the permission of the Diocese. Last week, after presenting our proposal and bids, Bishop Checchio and Diocesan Board of Consultors granted approval and authorization for us to go forward with hiring contractors and to spend the approximately one million dollars needed to do the following:

- Erect scaffolding throughout the church
- Evaluate and repair all of the wall, ceiling and ornamental plaster
- Completely repaint the entire church interior
- Conserve the upper clerestory wall artwork—ten rondels depicting various saints
- Provide decorative elements suitable to the architecture and that honors the historical record of church.
- Address some of the lighting deficiencies and include some up lighting and accent lighting that will have an associated control system.

(Note that we already installed a new church heat system, restored the large murals and completed structural repair work at the upper column capitals)

The mock up section currently in the church gives some idea of how the church will look. Work is scheduled to begin after May 7 and conclude before October. During that time the church will not be available for use. Weekend Masses will be celebrated in the downstairs parish hall. However, the parish hall will also have some added structural support columns that we will need to work around.

Over the past couple of years we have had a Capital Campaign called *Step Forward With Christ*, inviting everyone to help provide the care that our historic church needs. We hope to reach our goal of \$725,000. To date, \$683,530 has been pledged. We are grateful to all who have generously contributed. If you have not already done so, please help us to reach our goal by making a contribution. A check or envelop may be placed in the collection or sent by mail.
